PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

Welcome back! The Westglen staff is ready to go and looking forward to another great year with our students. Our team looks much the same as last year. Mrs. Tammy Bedard joins our team of Educational Assistants, Mr. Dave Pettis is our newest custodian and Miss Lauren Smith will be teaching for Mrs. Visser, who is on leave.

Previously, teachers have allowed cell phones to be used in their classrooms at certain times. We now have enough Chromebooks that this is not necessary anymore. **Cell phones will not be used at any time**. There is a growing body of research that has influenced our decision, because we are becoming increasingly concerned about the growing rates of cell phone addiction and other issues surrounding middle schoolers and technology. We realize that many of our students will have a cell phone in their possession, so it must be secured in their lockers at all times while they are at Westglen. If you need to relay a message to your child, please call the office because your child will not be able to read or respond to texts until 3:10.

As well, we will be piloting a new Chinook's Edge electronic gradebook, Power Teacher. Mrs. Shields will have emailed you already to notify you of your login information. There is an app that you can download, but we will caution you that it is far better to access the information on a computer so that you can receive all of the information. We have been learning how to use the program this week. We are excited about the opportunities it will provide for us to communicate about your child's learning. We will be using a percentage and a 5-point scale to share student achievement in clear, "parent friendly" categories in each subject. Additionally, the report card will also allow teachers to report personalized information about each student in relation to learner attributes, areas of strengths and ways in which parents can support students' learning or next steps. At the end of September, as we begin to input marks and information, we will be sharing more specific information about Power Teacher and how you can access it.

As always, we remain partners in ensuring success for your child. If you have questions, please contact your child's teacher while an issue is minor and can be more easily dealt with. We look forward to meeting and reconnecting with each of you throughout the year. Our first opportunity will be at Meet the Teacher on Thursday.

DON'T FORGET!

Please remember to call the school if your child is going to be absent or late. You can call anytime and leave a message. This saves a lot of time and phone calls in the office every morning! Because students are not always with their homeroom teachers first thing in the morning, it is best to call the office as well as leaving a note in your child's agenda.

MEDICAL ALERTS

If your child has a serious, life threatening medical condition please request a Medical Alert Form from the office and return it promptly. These need to be updated yearly so our information is current. Please include a recent photo of your child as well.



Chinook's Edge has listened to parents about the quantity of paperwork that is required to complete when their child(ren) are going on a field trip. The Division is in the process of implementing an online form for field trips.

What this means for parents – parents will receive a customized email with the details of the field trip included in the email. A link will be included that will give parents access to an online form and payment option. Parents will be required to complete the medications, allergies, dietary restrictions and medical conditions sections on the form. Most of these sections are yes or no buttons. There is a Parent or Guardian Consent to agree to along with a Medication Administration and Release to consent to. The Acknowledgement of Risk and Informed Consent is outlined for parents. Once the information has been completed, the parent submits the form and then a link to the Acorn payment system will be provided.

Forms Auto Complete – after the first time parents complete the student portion of the form, on the next field trip, the form will auto-complete the information. Parents will still have to complete the medications portion of each form as this may have changed since the last trip.

Lost or deleted field trip consent emails – if the email parents received is accidentally deleted, parents can contact the school office and a copy can be forwarded to them.

No home internet access – if internet access is an issue, the school can provide parents with a paper copy of the forms. The school will scan in the completed form when it is complete.

How does the teacher or school know when parents complete the field trip forms – the teacher and school can run a report with the trip details.

I am not getting emails for field trips – please ensure that the school has your current email address.

This online form is designed for parents to complete the process in a timely manner and not have to hand write several sets of forms throughout the school year.
