### 2020-21 ANNUAL DEMOGRAPHIC UPDATE

2020-21 Annual Demographic Updates are due. If you have not completed yours, please log into PowerSchool Parent Portal and click on SchoolEngage in the left side bar at the bottom. Instructions on how to complete the forms were emailed earlier this month. Please call the office if you need any help.

As per requirement from Alberta Education, all schools are asked to have Parents/Guardians verify their child(rens) record information every year.

These verification forms are used at the school level to:

1. Provide information to you for CRA (Canada Revenue Agency), should you ever have to provide school information for an audit.


2. Provide Alberta Education an audit on Students enrollment.

3. Provide updated emergency, medical information and phone numbers for the school.

This form is your responsibility to submit every year and/or as changes occur in relation to your child. If you need help getting into the Parent Portal, or need your password reset, please call the office.

We were advised that there is an option on either the online assessment or by calling 811 to mention that travel is an issue. Arrangements will be made with either Public Health or Home Care to come to your home to take the swab.

\*Note: If these are symptoms of a pre-existing condition and a person has tested negative to COVID-19, then these rules do not need to be applied.

#### A Back to School message from the School Immunization Program

Welcome back to a brand new school year, we hope this message finds you healthy and safe. We are pleased to continue to provide immunization services to your school community as long as COVID-19 response measures allow.

When schools closed in March 2020, our school-based immunization program was unable to continue as school immunization teams were redeployed to respond to the COVID-19 crisis.

Due to this suspension in service, you will notice some changes to our program this year as we attempt to "catch-up":

- Students in grade 6 in the 2019-2020 school year (now in grade 7) who did not complete their Hepatitis B (HBV) and/or Human Papillomavirus (HPV) and/or any outstanding routine vaccine series will be immunized within the school setting. We will only immunize those students with a signed consent form from the previous school year(s).
- 2. Students in other grades where an immunization consent form was signed in the previous school year(s) will be immunized in the school setting in order to complete any outstanding immunization series.


If you do not wish your child to complete their immunization series or your child was immunized privately within the past 6 months, please contact your school's designated Community Health Centre.

More information will be available in the coming weeks regarding school-based immunizations for our target grade 6 and 9 students. Public Health is developing strategies to address access to immunization for those students enrolled in alternative learning environments this school year.

During times of pandemic, such as COVID-19, we are reminded of how important it is utilize the immunizations that protect us against vaccine-preventable diseases like measles and pertussis that are still present globally and locally.

We look forward to working with our school communities again to help keep students healthy.
