We are a non profit society established in 2014 to serve people in need. 100% of all donations are used to directly benefit people in Didsbury. Each week we hand out groceries, vouchers, milk and egg vouchers, and gas cards. We prepare hot meals and even set up a mini grocery store for folks to pick up items they will use. On average we serve between 70-80 meals every Thursday.
