## PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

As it does every year, spring has brought the return of bikes, scooters and skateboards. While we are thrilled to see so many students getting some physical activity on their way to and from the school, there are a large number of them who are engaging in some very unsafe behaviour. Please discuss safety rules with your children, particularly not just shooting into crosswalks without checking for oncoming traffic. Walking their bikes through crosswalks is an important safety issue as well as riding along the shoulder of the road and obeying traffic signs. As well, please remember that helmets are mandatory for students riding a bike.

Vehicle traffic – Thank you again for being so respectful of our parking lot and traffic challenges at the school. In most families, our emails only go to one parent and we are finding that many people are still unaware that there should be **no vehicle traffic in the teacher parking lot at all during the school day** (unless you need to access the handicap parking). Even if you are "only going to be a minute", we would ask that you please park in the designated areas. Especially with the weather warming up, our students are using this area regularly throughout the school day. Additionally, if there are vehicles parked at the curb, it creates difficulty for handicapped accessibility.

#### BAND UPDATE


All school instruments must be returned to the school by June 17th so that they can be sent away for cleaning and any repairs. Please make arrangements for your child's instrument to be at the school by that date.






